CATTLE SECTION RULES & CONDITIONS

1. **1. HEALTH AND SAFETY:** The Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey all signs and the instructions of the Organiser, Officials and Stewards.
2. **CONDITIONS:**
 - 2.1 The organisers reserve the right to eliminate or refuse any entry or limit the number of entries in any class and to cancel, merge or alter any class.
 - 2.2 The organisers will not be responsible for any accident or loss of property or otherwise arising from any cause connected with the show and it is a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the organisers blameless and shall indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings.
 - 2.3 No entry fee will be refunded in any class without the submission of a valid Doctor/Veterinary Surgeons certificate.
 - 2.4 Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and it is on this understanding only those entries are accepted.
3. All exhibitors must be aware of the rules relating to animal movements. These can be found on the DEFRA website: www.gov.uk/government/organisations/animal-and-plant-health-agency or from your local APHA Office.
4. Any exhibitor failing to comply with any DEFRA regulations will be asked to leave the showground.
5. All cattle must be on the showground by 8.30am. Judging will commence at 9:00am.
6. Holding Number: **17/322/8003**
7. **DISEASED ANIMALS:** Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against all actions, claims, proceedings and demands by any person, company or other representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with the bringing onto the Society's showground of any animal which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the showground and in addition the exhibitor shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Society in connection with any such claim. The Society's Veterinary Officers are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to or have removed from the showground any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease. The exhibitor or such animal may obtain a certificate from the Show Secretary, stating the nature of such disease or infection. The onus of proving the freedom of any such animal from contagious or infectious disease shall rest on the exhibitor of the animal concerned.
8. **BIOSECURITY** – Full biosecurity measures in force on the date of the Show are to be strictly adhered to. Livestock vehicles must arrive having been cleaned and disinfected before leaving home. Special attention should be given to the vehicle's wheel arches and footwell. Please ensure that before leaving the Showground vehicles are clean and disinfected & that all contaminated clothing is changed. Please remember **"BE SEEN TO BE CLEAN"**.
9. **OFFICIALS DECISIONS:** The Committee, or officials appointed by them, shall be empowered to disqualify and demand the removal from the showground of any animal which, in their opinion, is suffering from or affected with, a contagious or infectious disease or is considered dangerous. All entrance fees for such animals will be forfeited. If an animal is deemed to be unfit for competing by the Society's appointed veterinary surgeon; they reserve the right to deny entry to the ring and can request that animal/s be removed from the showground. The Society's veterinary officer's decision is final
10. **CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES:** All persons in charge of animals will be subject to the instruction of the Society's appointed officials. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees and for the consequence of any misconduct of such employees. Should Security deem an exhibitor or their employee's behaviour to fall below that expected by the Societies appointed officials that person or persons will be escorted from the showground.
11. All cattle must be trained to be halter led and to have the proper halters at all times. Bulls - Exhibitors must comply with the HSE Guidance Note GS36 "Safe Custody of Bulls at Agricultural Shows, Markets

or similar premises off the farm". Guidance Note GS36 gives appropriate methods for handling bulls at events.

- a) Two people, one using a bull pole attached to the bull's nose ring and the other using a rope or chain attached to the halter or head chain via the nose ring.
 - b) Two people both using ropes or chains, one rope or chain attached to a halter, the other attached directly to the nose ring or via the nose ring to the halter.
 - c) One person using a bull pole attached to the bull's nose ring and a rope or chain attached to a halter, or head chain via the nose ring, with a competent person standing by able to assist in the control of the bull if required.
 - d) One person using a rope or chain attached to a halter with a second rope or chain attached directly to the nose ring or via the nose ring to the halter with a competent person standing by able to assist in control if necessary.
12. Please NOTE any bull over 10 months old being led on the showground MUST be accompanied by TWO handlers at all times. Young persons should not be allowed to handle bulls.
 13. Livestock with unstable or aggressive temperament should not be brought to the showground.
 14. **BREED SOCIETY REGULATIONS** All persons entering, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class affiliated to a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including disciplinary procedures).
 15. **ANIMAL WELFARE:** The Society expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.
 16. **APPOINTED VETERINARY SURGEON:** A Veterinary Surgeon will be available all day on the showground. If, for whatever reason, they may be required please inform a steward and they will get the vet to you. The owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of any veterinary advice and/or treatment and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

 17. In the unfortunate event of an animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.
 18. **PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE:** All exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public liability insurance cover. By submitting an entry you indemnify the HCSS that on or from the date of application up to and including the end of the Hanbury Countryside Show the applicant will hold valid insurance to insure against loss or damage caused to any person or property to a minimum value of £2 million.
 19. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
 20. **OBJECTION PROTOCOL:** Any objection or protest to be lodged with the Livestock Secretary within 30 minutes of the event in writing, together with the sum of £100 as deposit, such amount to be forfeited if the objection is overruled. The matter will be referred to the objection panel. Objections may not be settled on the day.
 21. **JUDGES:** Should a Judge be unable to officiate, a substitute will be appointed. Any judge substitutions will be listed on the website and at the sheep secretaries marquee.
 22. **ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees vary, all fees are stated in the Schedule. The Society is VAT registered. Receipts available on request. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees.
 23. **PRIZE MONEY** that is not collected in horse rings can be collected on Show Day from the Livestock Secretaries Marquee; before 5.30pm. Prize money not collected at the Show will be deemed a donation to the Society.
 24. **PASSES & TICKETS:** All entries to be made in advance unless otherwise stated. **Show entrance tickets will be emailed. On arrival at the Showground please go to the Secretaries to collect your number/s.**
 25. **TIMETABLE OF CLASSES:** available from www.hanburyshow.co.uk
 26. **CHAMPIONSHIPS:** The first and second prize winners in each class are invited to compete for the Championship.
 27. **ACCESSING THE SHOWGROUND:** It is recommended to set off in good time before your class/s are scheduled to start. Please follow the yellow AA directional signs. No exhibits will be permitted to leave the showground until after 3.45 pm and after the Grand Parade without authority signed by the Show Manager.
 28. **DOGS:** Dogs are welcome; however, they must be kept under control & on a short lead at all times. Please ensure all dog waste is picked up and placed in the bins provided. Please note that all 'banned breeds' of dogs are not permitted on the Showground. Banned breeds are those designated on the 'banned breed' list by the UK Government; the full list of 'banned breeds' can be viewed on the Gov.uk

website. Furthermore, 'banned breed' dogs with certificates of exemption are also not permitted entry to the Show. The owner / handler of any dog deemed to be behaving aggressively will be asked to leave the showground. The Show organisers will not tolerate dangerous or out of control dogs.

29. In the interests of safety, there should be no UNAUTHORISED movement of animals during the Show period. All livestock will be required to be paraded as directed by the stewards. Stock attendants shall wear white coats or appropriate Society dress at judging and parade.

30. Grand Parade: Exhibitors must ensure that sufficient stockmen are available to lead all first and second prize winning animals for the parade. All other exhibitors are welcome to parade. The Grand Parade will take place in the Main Arena at 3.15pm. **All class winners should (and all other competitors are invited to) take part in the Grand Parade.**

We are delighted to announce that this year we shall be offering **THREE prizes of £100 to THREE exhibitors who participate in the Grand Parade.** Each handler will be handed a raffle ticket and a draw will be made to decide the winners! We would like to sincerely thank ELGANY FARMS for their kind sponsorship of these prizes.

31. In the event of an Accident: The Society should be informed immediately by contacting a steward/official.

32. To comply with health and safety, there will be NO SMOKING in the sheep lines.

33. TROPHIES: All trophy winners must sign for them at the secretary's trailer before leaving the showground. All trophies, unless stated, are perpetual and are to be held for the period between shows. Trophies must be returned cleaned, in good condition and returned no less than six weeks before the Show. Trophies must be insured – guidance available from Trophy Secretary. Please note some trophies cannot be removed from the showground and will be retained by the Society. These trophies are available for photographs.

34. CANCELLATIONS: If the Show is cancelled due to poor weather (where the field is considered unusable by the committee) or any other reason outside the Society's control, the Society will refund the entry fee minus £5.00 to cover administration costs.

35. DATA STORAGE: Information from entry forms may be stored on computer; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information about exhibitors and their animals may also be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Depts. of County Councils, BCMS, SAC, and others having regulatory functions as well as the Society's Veterinary, Environmental Health, Legal and Safety Advisers. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.

36. The Society will provide a portable milk machine. The milk produced is the responsibility of the exhibitor; milk must NOT be dumped on showground.

37. All ages are as of show date.

38. The Showground operates a 5mph maximum speed limit. Please take care when reversing.

39. Please ensure your animals have sufficient water for the duration of the day.

40. Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and it is on this understanding only those entries are accepted.

41. The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all Officials and Stewards. It is a condition of entry that exhibitors conform to the requirements of the Society's Safety Policy and of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and for ensuring that safe working practices are followed by themselves, their employees, Agents and Contractors. A full copy of our Health and Safety policy can be found on our website.
